UNITED NATIVE FRIENDSHIP CENTRE

The United Native Friendship Centre is dedicated to enhancing the lives of native and non-native people in Fort Frances and the surrounding area. Its primary responsibility is to serve Indigenous people with special services in the fields of social, educational and cultural development while at the same time building a bridge between native and non-native people.

LIFE LONG CARE PROGRAM

This program delivers and coordinates culturally based community services to urban Indigenous people with chronic illness, cognitive impairment, physical disability, frailty, old age or HIV/AIDS that promote an integrated response community participation, independent living and improved/high quality of life.

Friendly Visiting:

Provides direct-service users with a one-to-one visit on a regular basis. They are generally home visits but can be provided elsewhere

Transportation: Provides escorted transportation to medical appointments, shopping and various social activities and programs

Congregate Dining: This service is a support service that provides transportation a nutritious meal and a social activity to direct-service users.

Indigenous Support: Provided to eligible Indigenous participants living off reserve. The purpose of the service is to support participants with information, referral, advocacy and access to mainstream long-term care services.

Security Checks: Provides isolated persons, or those with Alzheimer's disease or other dementias with regular contact to determine that the direct-service user is not in crisis or risk of harm. This service may be provided by a person visiting the home, by telephone or other means.

ELDER ABUSE

Elder abuse is any action or non-action by a friend, family member, neighbor or paid caregiver that harms an older person or jeopardizes the person's health and welfare.

Types of Abuse

- Physical Abuse Pushing, slapping, kicking, hitting, over-medicating or the threat of physical force
- Emotional Abuse Name calling, bullying, social isolation or treating the older adult "like a child"
- Financial Abuse withholding or stealing money, improper use of the older adult's money, selling of possessions
- Sexual Abuse Unwanted forms of sexual contact, inappropriate comments
- Spiritual Abuse Restriction or loss of spiritual practices, customs or traditions
- Neglect Denial of necessary care including nutrition, shelter, clothing or medical needs.

Signs of Elder Abuse may not be recognized because they may be mistaken as signs of other medical conditions.

Possible Indicators of Abuse

- **Signs of Physical Abuse** Unexplained physical injuries, cuts, bruises, burns or bites
- **Signs of Emotional Abuse** Depression, fear, anxiety, withdrawn
- **Signs of Financial Abuse** Unusual bank withdrawals, failure to meet financial obligations, personal belongings missing, sudden change in will
- **Signs of Neglect** Lack of food, clothing or other necessities, change in hygiene, change in or poor nutrition, untreated bed sores

WESWAY - SENIORS RESPITE - FAMILY DIRECTED FUNDING

Wesway provides funding for respite for families who are caring for a senior family member who meets eligibility criteria. Wesway allocates funds for respite directly to families who can then hire their own independent service providers. The respite provider is not an employee of Wesway.

Eligibility: The family member must have a disability or a chronic health condition (e.g. a documented developmental disability, a physical disability, a frail condition related to aging, Alzheimer Disease or a related dementia, etc.). To be eligible for funding the disability or chronic health condition must result in a significant dependence on the family caregiver for day to day care.

A contract is developed with each family depending on available resources and eligibility. Within the terms and conditions of their contract families are free to pursue their personal respite goals and priorities. Family caregivers are responsible for managing the funds provided to them.

Respite care can vary in frequency, duration and location. Some examples:

- In the family home
- Out of the home
- Daytime, evenings, weekends or overnight
- For a few hours or a longer time
- Through community activities
- In an emergency
- For a short vacation

Respite care may be provided in a variety of ways:

- Through an established relationship with a trusted friend or neighbour
- Through a recognized community recreation group or activity program
- By purchasing additional service from another organization which already provides personal support to their family member.

FRAUDS, SCAMS AND THEFTS

Fraud is the number one crime against seniors. Seniors are often targeted by con artists for a number of reasons:

- They often live alone and have more savings, assets or disposable income.
- They are often home during the day and available.
- Generally, they are more trusting.
- They may have been scammed before and fraud artists will share lists of victims.
- Many seniors do not report losing their money to a con artist because they are embarrassed and ashamed at having been deceived.

There are many types of frauds, scams and thefts. Scams can be conducted over the telephone, by mail, over the Internet and door-to-door. Often, you will be pressured into donating or purchasing right now! Prizes, vacations, charities, club memberships or investments can be the front used by con artists.

Remember, you are in control. If you do not wish to buy something, simply say "NO".

Identity Theft is becoming an increasingly popular crime. Identity theft steals your good name, your money, even your self-respect.

- Store your birth certificate, passport and documents containing personal information in a safe place.
- Keep your bank card's personal identification number (PIN) secret.
- Never provide personal information such as your SIN, date of birth, credit card number or PIN over the telephone unless you initiate the call.
- Sign all credit cards when you receive them and never loan them to anyone.
- Check out a missing or late credit card or bank statement immediately and report lost or stolen cards immediately.
- Review bank and credit card statements frequently, report discrepancies immediately and shred old documents.

Remember:

- Buyer Beware!
- You do not get something for nothing.
- If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

Accessible Parking permit

People with certain health conditions can apply for an accessible parking permit. The permit when displayed in the vehicle will allow them to park in a handicapped parking space.

Your health care practitioner must certify that you have a health condition which meets the criteria for the accessible parking permit.

Healthcare practitioner include: physician, chiropractor, registered nurse practitioner, physiotherapist, occupational therapist, chiropodist or podiatrist.
